The techniques used on him were:

MINDLESS CHANTING—"We had to chant for hours every day to purify ourselves. It gave me feelings of numbness which led to feeling ecstatic."

INTIMIDATION—"We were forced to listen to lectures sitting cross-legged on the floor because, we were not allowed to expose the soles of our feet to the statues we worshipped."

BAN ON FREE SPEECH—"We were
