Roy Christopher Richard, 30, also was excluded from the murder prosecution in return for his testimony in court.

The nine-count indictment was unsealed Monday, following Davis' arrest at home Sunday night, and was announced by Sheriff Brad Gates and Jerry N. Jenson, DEA regional director.

According to Hart, the indictment charges that Davis, also known as Dritavarata, arranged to purchase hashish oil from a Pakistani named Rashid and then recruited and trained couriers with Richard, also known as Rsavdeva Das, to smuggle the contraband into the United States.

Davis gave the couriers typewriter cases and money to buy businessmen's clothing, Hart said. The hashish oil was concealed in air pockets in the typewriter cases and then was placed in baby feeding bottles for distribution to customers, he said.

The couriers traveled by commercial airlines on round-about routes through such countries as West Germany, Japan, Thailand and India and then slipped past U.S. customs officials, said Hart.

In addition to Davis and Richard, named in the indictment were: Robert Shea, 40; Fedorowski, 28, also known as Gupta Das; Dean Allan Greenberg, 28, also known as Shrinjaya; Robert Leonard Garreras, 36, also known as Ugadarma; Patrick William Kenealy, 30, also known as Uddhavareta; Lawrence Dana Montgomery, 30, also known as Somvatsara; Douglas Hart Snyder, 26, also known as Dumrakesa; Gary Gene Roberts, 29, also known as Gopta; and Jack Carreras, 32, also known as Janaka Rsi.
